



Conflict Minerals Policy

Conflict Minerals refers to minerals or other materials mined in countries where revenues may be used to finance armed groups engaged in supporting a civil war, resulting in serious environmental and social abuses. In 2010 United States passed HR4173, the Dodd-Frank Reform Bill. Section 1502(b) requires US Stock listed companies and their suppliers to ensure the chain of custody and usage of Conflict minerals.

Accutron expects our suppliers to source materials from socially responsible suppliers.

Accutron expects its suppliers to comply with the Dodd-Frank regulation and provide certification.

Accutron's suppliers are expected to pass these requirements down their supply chain where necessary.

Accutron will use the resources provided by "Z2" to verify compliance where required. Suppliers who are found to be Non-Compliant to these requirements will be removed from our supply chain. Accutron's policy is to not knowingly purchase products that contain conflict minerals.

This policy is in line with Global Business Initiatives on Human Rights.
